Performance – 25 points

The way the performer uses his/her voice to effectively deliver the composition. Is the performer's intonation and/or pitch accurate?	This includes the use of dress props, stagehands, dancers; are these symbols of communication assisting or interfering with the overall performance?
Is the performer singing clear and distinct in his/her articulation and delivery of the song.?	

"Groove is the word often used to describe the aspect of certain music that makes one want to move, dance, or "groove". It can also be described as "rhythmic patterns" that sets in motion dancing or foot-tapping on the part of listeners."
